JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Build, maintain, install and repair wooden, steel, and concrete bridges, roads, culverts, fences, posts and related facilities.
- Clear forest roads and facilities of brush and fallen timber by use of brush saws, chainsaws and other tools.
- Operate a 12-yard dump truck to deliver materials used in road construction and maintenance.
- Work closely with heavy equipment operators as a ground person, guiding excavation and assisting in grade preparations.
- · Inspect watershed assets.
- Perform reforestation, stream restoration and habitat improvement activities.
- Perform wildland fire suppression duties including laying hoses, operating pumps and other related firefighting equipments.

Work Environment/Physical Demands:

- Must be available to work all shifts, nights, evenings, weekends, and holidays.
- Required to work outdoors in all types of weather and terrain.
- Respond to emergency conditions resulting in overtime with little or no advance notice.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Experience:

- Two (2) years' experiences in forestry, logging, road construction and maintenance, or closely related heavy outdoor work AND
- Two (2) years of general construction experience OR
- A combination of education and/or training and/or experience which provides an equivalent background required to perform the work of the class.

Licensing:

 The successful candidate must obtain a current Washington State driver license by their date of hire.

Candidates must provide proof of driving record by submitting their "FULL Abstract
 Driving Record" as part of this application package (select link below for information).

"Full Abstract of Driving Record" must not be older than 30 days from the date of application.

The successful candidates, at a minimum, must demonstrate skills and abilities to:

- Safely drive low volume, low maintained forest roads with rough surfaces and varying widths.
- Perform extensive driving, lifting, carrying and other heavy physical labor.
- Operate assorted hand and power tools such as carpentry tools, chainsaws, brush saws, pumps, generators, compactors, rock drills, tractors, straw blowers, hydro seeders, etc.
- · Work with timber falling and emphasis on hazard tree abatement.
- Follow oral and written instructions and work from standard specifications for municipal public works construction.
- Meet the conditions set forth in <u>Our City Values</u>, <u>Workplace Expectations</u>, <u>Racial Equity and Social Justice</u> and SPU Safety.
- · Perform other related duties as required and assigned.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selected Candidate(s) will have the following On the Job Opportunities/Benefits paid for by SPU:

- Washington State Class B Commercial Driver License (CDL) with tanker endorsement, airbrake and manual transmission restrictions removed will be obtained within the first four (4) months of employment and retained throughout employment.
- National Wildland Firefighting Incident Qualification Card required within one (1) year of appointment. Must be able to meet and maintain physical requirements for obtaining the card. (National Wildfire Coordinating Group standards require annual recertification. Arduous Pack Test involves fieldwork calling for above-average endurance and superior conditioning. All firefighters are required to perform arduous duty. Current Arduous test is carrying a 45lb pack along a 3-mile flat course in less than 45 minutes. This test is conducted each spring and is required to maintain the candidate's wildfire qualifications on an annual basis.
- Completion of <u>S212 Wildland Fire Chain Saws</u> course will be required within one (1) year of appointment.

The Ideal Candidate(s) should possess:

- Washington State Class B Commercial Driver License (CDL) with tanker endorsement, airbrake and manual transmission restrictions removed OR the ability to obtain the CDL through SPU provided training within four (4) months of training.
- Applicants with experience in timber falling with an emphasis on hazard tree abatement.
